

SPELLING OF "-d", "-ed" and "-ied" FOR REGULAR VERBS.

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RULE	END OF VERB	EXAMPLE	RULE	FINAL FORM -ED	
1	A CONSONANT + e	smile / erase	add - "d"	smiled / erased	FOR RULE 2, some verbs have two syllables, exam. VISIT has two, VIS + it. In this verb, the STRESS is on the first syllable. VISit ---> VISitED. (NOT DOBLE CTE) For the verb ADMIT, has two syllables ad + MIT, the STRESS is on the second syllable. adMIT ---> adMITTED (DOBLE CTE)
2	ONE VOWEL + ONE CONSONANT	stop / rub	doble CTE + add - "ed"	stopped / rubbed	
2.1	ONE VOWEL + ONE CONSONANT	fix / snow	Do not doble consonant, only add -"ed"	fixed / snowed	
3	TWO VOWELS + ONE CONSONANT	rain / need	add - "ed"	rained / needed	
4	TWO CONSONANTS	count / help	add - "ed"	counted / helped	
5	A CONSONANT + y	study / carry	change "y" to "i" + add - "ed"	studied / carried	
6	A VOWEL + y	play / enjoy	add - "ed"	played / enjoyed
